THE PROGRAM

This summer study abroad program in Italy offers courses in textile design, styling, and manufacturing at the established Santa Reparata International School of Art, located in the heart of the Renaissance City of Florence. The program aims to create an inter-disciplinary approach to Textile Design and Interior Design, in both undergraduate and graduate levels. Through lectures, demonstrations, and intensive studio work at the school and at the Fuji studio, students will come to understand the entire process of creating and manufacturing sophisticated textiles. They will follow the process from initial research and design to finished product and end-use in palazzo and villa style furnishings. Additional visits to Renaissance cities and villages will also provide invaluable cultural and historical perspectives of the distinctly Italian-style furnishings.

Santa Reparata School has excellent studio facilities for print making, a computer lab and an open-air court yard studio space. Fuji studio is spacious and well-equipped for fabric printing. The studio work time will increase toward the last week, allowing the students to immerse themselves in the studio to finalize design and production. The final critique will be conducted on the last day of the class. A portfolio of work samples is required for both courses for review purposes. Program enrollment is limited to 16 participants; therefore, registration priority will be given to those who participate in the tour. The courses will be taught collaboratively by two instructors; therefore, students enrolled in one course will gain exposure to both studio segments of the program.

OPTIONAL TOUR

“Italian Textile Museums, Mills, and Studio Tour,” organized as a separate excursion preceding the studio course, is optional and offers guided field research for the studio component of the program. Students will have a rare opportunity to review archives and collections in museums and palazzos. They will also visit important silk mills in Milan, Como, and Venice. Graduate students are highly encouraged to sign up for both the tour and the studio course, however, the tour is not a mandatory prerequisite for participation in the studio course. ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to advanced undergraduate and graduate students as either a major or an elective studio course, and for textile design and interior design professionals as continuing education. All students must be accepted into the program by submitting the application form and materials for review by the director. Enrollment is limited to 16 students.

CREDIT

Georgia State University students may receive course credits through major and non-major elective registration. Participants who successfully complete a course will receive either 4 semester hours of undergraduate course credit (TEXT 4000) or 3 semester hours of graduate course credit (TEXT 8000) for 90 contact hours and extensive research / studio work outside the class.

COST

Program cost may vary according to currency fluctuations and travel arrangements. Fees are tentatively set at \$1,968 for undergraduates (4 credits) and \$1,920 for graduates (3 credits).

Upon acceptance to the study abroad program, non-Georgia State University students who would be considered transient/visiting students at Georgia State, if they wish to receive credit for the study abroad course, will be required to provide all of the following:
